




MTFCA National Tour #2 Highland Rim Tour Cookeville, TN August 17-22 2019 Hosted by the Tennessee T's



I had a problem on the tour with my battery not charging.? It got so bad that I had to push start the car on the last day.? I had an alternator so it shouldn't have been a problem.? Thinking it was the voltage regulator on the Alternator, I called the guy who makes them when I got home.? He had me check the voltage of the alternator terminal with the car not running.? It was 6.2 volts like it was supposed to be.? I then started the car and checked it again. It was 7.2 volts so the alternator was not the problem.? I played with the wires on the back of the ammeter (they were fairly tight) but with effort, I could move them and when I did, the problem was cured!!? I could start the car on battery and the lights worked (after I flipped the light switch several times). Corrosion on the back of the ammeter connections was the problem the whole time!! Darrel

TWO Malfunctioning Generators

Back in March of this year I was taking 3 of my Model T's out of winter storage. I keep an enclosed Car ready-to-run and driven regularly during cold weather, so the gas gets consumed before it has a Chance to go bad. Then, each of the other Cars get their tanks drained, then I run the Car until the Carb runs dry, then park it until Spring.

This past March, I gas 'em up, Cranked 'em and they fired right up with no issues running. But two of them had non-functioning generators. Photo #1 shows the first generator's tarnished commutator. (Bluish and black- nonconductive)

So, out comes the faithful commutator cleaner, which worked great on the first generator. It got me charging 10 minutes later.






Between working on the first generator and the second, I talked to Gary Wheat and told him about my generator problem. He told me that he tried spraying WD-40 on the commutator, then then rotated the motor with the hand-Crank (no power applied). He then looked at the commutator and realized that the tarnish had disappeared. He then started the motor and had Charge going to the battery. GOOD NEWS!



I tried Gary's method, and had the same results. See photo #2.


The girls asked if we drove it on the highway, about luggage rack, how to lock the doors, where are the seat belts, etc.
