






The Tennessee T's club is a member of both the MTFCA and the MTFCI. Most of our members are also members of both associations that help preserve our hobby and our historic old cars.





Mark & Paula Gember recently completed a 10-day tour through New Mexico, hosted by Dennis & Karen Dakan of the Colorado High Peaks Ts. The progressive tour originated in Socorro, NM. This tour was originally conceived by long-standing Tennessee Ts club member Don Krull, who passed away Feb 9, 2022. Dennis stepped in and completed Don's vision for the tour.

With its ever-changing landscape, unique rock formations, diverse culture, and numerous state parks, New Mexico definitely had a lot to see and do. Here are some of the highlights of our tour through the "Land of Enchantment."





Elephant Butte State Park, near Truth or Consequences, is the state's largest reservoir and largest state park, and is named after a rock formation that resembles an elephant. We couldn't see the resemblance, but the sand sculpture was impressive.



We enjoyed lunch at a 50's style diner literally in the middle of *nowhere*

The Route 66 Auto Museum in Santa Rosa, has over 30 privately owned cars. The highway, *established in 1926*, spans 2,448 miles from Santa Monica to Chicago. It was officially removed from the US highway system in 1985, but the nostalgia of this scenic route continues to attract car enthusiasts from all over the globe.







The Edsel excavator outside the museum was fully functional, in spite of its flat tire.







The deep blue water flowing from the naturally occurring, bell-shaped artesian well in Santa Rosa is one of the most popular destinations in the US for scuba diving and training.



The Billy The Kid Museum in Fort Sumner, NM, houses more than 60,000 relics from the period of "the Kid's" reign of terror.





The large, 100 year-old museum contains Billy the Kid's rifle, knife & riding chaps, reward posters and artifacts from the period, a large collection of long rifles & cowboy memorabilia, as well as several Model T's that came from the area.








In Roswell, we went to the International UFO Museum & Research Center, that was founded after the UFO 'crash' near here in 1947. Mark had some fun with a couple of aliens, and we enjoyed numerous exhibits documenting UFO sightings and reported abductions from across the country.








Carlsbad Caverns, discovered in 1898 by a young teen, is the largest, readily accessible cave in all of North America, with over 30 miles of passages. It has over 8.5 acres of unique rock formations in its chamber at the bottom, called the "Big Room."







We noticed a very strong smell of bat guano (bat poop!) as we followed the winding trail downward. We walked 1.5 miles and descended more than 75 stories into the cave. Words can't begin to describe the beauty of the formations we saw throughout the cave. You just have to come see it for yourself. It was awesome!









White Sands National Park is ~228 square miles of 30+ foot deep sand dunes composed of pure white gypsum crystals, and is completely surrounded by the White Sands Missile Range. The oldest known human footprints in North America were discovered here & date back more than 23,000 years.













Near Magdalena, 27 radio telescopes all work together as one to examine the far reaches of our solar system and explore deep into space.

Pie Town is known for pies! Their New Mexico Apple Pie contains green chiles from nearby Hatch, NM, apples & pine nuts







During our stay in Alamogordo, we were startled by several LOUD (sonic) booms. We learned they came from testing at White Sands Missile Range. It's a common occurrence here, but was a little unnerving for all of us.







Dixie and Mark are posed by one of the massive tires used by the mine's rock hauling trucks. Each tire costs a whopping \$80,000!

← We drove through the Black Range Mtns and the Gila National Forest, along hairpin turns & switchbacks, up nearly 9000 ft to Emory Pass. The view was - WOW!





New Mexico is one of three states that grows pistachios. The nuts thrive in the region's hot summers and chilly winters. Pecans are the #1 crop, followed by hay, peppers (green chiles), corn, wheat, peanuts and COTTON!



In Silver City, we visited the Santa Rita Mining operations. There are 7 active mines in the region with more coming. This pit is 7000 feet deep. Miners work 24/7 extracting silver, gold and copper.



We drove a winding road through several passes up to 8000 feet, then hiked 1.5 miles up another 1000 feet to the Gila Cliff Dwellings. The secluded ruins were inhabited by ancestral Pueblo around 1275, and remain remarkably preserved.









We encountered stormy weather when we left the ruins, a slick ride while we wove our way back through the passes & down the mountain. The day ended with a rainbow and clearing skies as we got to the hotel.



The 10-day "Land of Enchantment" tour covered more than 1500 miles. We stayed in Socorro, Truth or Consequences, Santa Rosa, Roswell, Carlsbad, Alamagordo, Silver City (2 days) and Quemado, before returning to our starting point in Socorro. Many thanks to our exceptional hosts Dennis & Karen Dakan for such a great tour.


